- hand painting Workshops you will have a chance to learn the traditional ornament hand painting techniques

OUR TIPS

ZALIPIE is one of the most impressive traditional Heritage Park in Poland. It presents unique art of house painting. Its origins reach back to the early 19th century when a 10 year old girl Felicja Cyrułowa decided to paint her house with colorful flowers. Its beauty spread through the village quickly, so that soon it became the landmark of the region. To commemorate the little artist, one of the huts had been baptized with her name and a small museum had been established inside.

OUR TIPS

CRACOW is a former capital of Poland. Founded back in the early medieval times, survived with its ancient beauty and splendor to the modern times. Its monuments are abundant. Unique in Europe, well preserved and exposed. Cracow is also considered a cultural capital of Poland, from where the best artists, actors and performers derive.

WIELICZKA SALT MINE is an absolutely outstanding and unique place. Over 700 years old mine is preserved in a perfect condition. On the rout you will have to climb 800 steps down to the 20 halls located 410ft deep. Make sure you are well equipped. Comfortable shoes are good idea.





DAY 5

OUR TIPS

This day has a bit relaxing itinerary. You will have a chance to see two wonderful medieval castles which are pearls among the stones in this part of Europe. Książ Castle - the mightiest in this region has had a mysterious history. Being a medieval fortress, a palace of the oligarchs and Nazi German keep, with miles of underground fortified tunnels.

Czocha castle is smaller but its night torched tour is thrilling!

Hopefuly, to restore powers, You will have a rest at the wonderful garden, tasting delicious traditional Polish cuisine and drinks.









DAY 6

ITINERARY

- Biskupin Tour with 1 hour narrow-gauge railway ride
- transfer to Sopot, at the Baltic Seaside
- late night accommodation in a hotel
- late supper







OUR TIPS

This is a transfer day. We will be getting from Southern part of Poland to the North, which takes time. In order to make the journey interesting, we offer a short attraction such as Biskupin Heritage Park, which is an astonishing reconstruction of pre-medieval Iron Age burgh.

So that the journey is even more convenient for You, we will take you for a short ride with a small narrow-gauge train - another unique piece of technology, which survived mostly in Poland.

Please make sure you prepare for the journey as we will stay in the bus for several hours, having short coffee stops.

GDANSK, as a part of the Polish Tripoli (Gdańsk-Sopot-Gdynia) is another must-see place for the newcomers. Crowded during the summer season by the Polish as well as foreign tourists still seems to have wonderful atmosphere.

SOPOT is a typical old-fashioned Polish seaside resort city. Its wonderful healing abilities quickly turned it into one of the most famous spas in this part of Europe.
